- 5.) To conduct Training and Orientations of Safety and Security for service providers and frontliners with DOT, TESDA and DOLE;
- 6.) To conduct regular updating of the TWG to the Governor and LCEs and to adopt the strategies accordingly;
- 7.) To provide plans and strategies for Rehabilitation and Recovery Projects for the tourism industry in the province;
 - a.) Establishment of two (2) Tourism Information Counters in San Jose Airport and Abra de Ilog Port.
 - b.) Production of Promotional Collaterals
 - c.) Tourism Promotional Vlogging Contest
 - d.) Financial Assistance/Subsidies to Pasalubong Centers/Handicraft Workers
 - e.) Loan assistance for tourism stakeholders to improve facilities to meet DOT standards.
 - f.) Capacitate farm tourism operators
- 8.) To spearhead the Promotion and Marketing of the tourism industry of the province.

Section 3. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE.

If any provision of this Executive Order is declared invalid for any reason, the parts not affected thereby shall remain valid and in full force and effect.

Section 4. REPEALING CLAUSE.

All Executive Orders, Rules and Regulations issued by this province which are inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Executive Order are hereby repealed, superseded or modified accordingly.

Section 5. EFFECTIVITY. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately.

Section 2. DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS OF THE TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP FOR THE RE-OPENING OF TOURISM INDUSTRY IN THE PROVINCE.

- 3.) To use the set of re-opening criteria to identify potential travel bubbles;
 - a.) Identify travel routes of tourists
 - b.) Identify service providers in these travel bubbles and identify training needs
- 4.) To establish a system of Monitoring and Documentation of tourists/visitors;
 - a.) Arrival of visitors
 - b.) Profile and contact information
 - c.) Where they came from
 - d.) Details of their stay
 - e.) Departure

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 70

Series of 2020

CREATION OF TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP FOR THE RE-OPENING OF TOURISM INDUSTRY IN THE PROVINCE OF OCCIDENTAL MINDORO AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, President Rodrigo Roa Duterte issued Presidential Proclamation No. 929 dated March 16, 2020 placing the entire country under a state of calamity due to COVID-19 and also imposing an Enhanced Community Quarantine throughout Luzon;

WHEREAS, due to the said imposition, tourism industry is one of the sectors greatly affected as hotels, resorts, restaurants, tourist destinations and attractions, among others, remained closed for areas under community quarantine.

WHEREAS, under DTI Memorandum Circular No. 20-22, Category IV Industries include tourist destinations such as but not limited to water parks, beaches, and resorts except those used as quarantine facility. Under the IATF Omnibus Guidelines, these are allowed to operate at a maximum of fifty percent (50%) operational capacity in areas under Modified General Community Quarantine (MGCQ);

WHEREAS, IATF Resolution No. 43 Series of 2020 dated June 3, 2020 was issued allowing hotels and other accommodation establishments to operate at a maximum of fifty percent (50%) operational capacity in areas under Modified General Community Quarantine (MGCQ) provided that these have DOT Accreditation and Certificate of Authority to Operate issued by the DOT.

WHEREAS, the Department of Tourism issued Administrative Order No. 2020-002 entitled "Guidelines on the Operations of Hotels and Other Accommodation Establishments Under a Community Quarantine";

WHEREAS, there is a need to promulgate this Executive Order to create a Technical Working Group that will be in charge for the setting up of plans and strategies for the eventual re-opening of tourism industry in the Province of Occidental Mindoro.

NOW THEREFORE, I, EDUARDO B. GADIANO, Governor of the Province of Occidental Mindoro, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order the following:

Section 1. CREATION OF TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP FOR THE RE-OPENING OF TOURISM INDUSTRY IN THE PROVINCE.
